This Indenture made the 11th day of July in the year of our Lord One Thousand Seven Hundred & Seventy three Between Arthur Cobb of the County of Southampton County of the One part & Samuel Story of the said County of the other part Witnesseth that the said Arthur Cobb for and in Consideration of the sum of Nineteen Pounds Ten Shillings Current Money of Virginia to him in hand paid by the said Samuel Story the Receipt whereof the said Arthur Cobb doth hereby Acknowledge hath granted bargained and sold Aliened Enfeoffed & Confirmed & by these presents doth grant bargain & sell alien Enfeoffed & Confirmed unto the said Samuel Story his Heirs & assigns forever One certain Tract or parcel of land lying and being in the County aforesaid containing by Estimation Seventy five or thereabouts more or less it being part of a Deed granted to the said Cobb by John Cobb bearing date the 2nd Day of April 1771 & bounded as follows to wit Beginning at a pine sapling a Line Tree between the aforesaid Cobb & Storys thence South fifteen Degrees East One Hundred fifty eight Poles to a black Oak in the
