This Indenture made the first day of January in the year of our Lord 1773
 the thirtieth year of the Reign of our sovereign Lord George the third of Great Britain
 between Edwin Gray Thomas of Virginia Gentlemen Trustees for the Indians of the
 Nottoway Nation of the County of Southampton and Colony aforesaid of the
 one Part and Henry Taylor of the County of Southampton and Colony aforesaid of the
 other Part Whereby an Act of the general assembly of the aforesaid Colony
 of Virginia passed in the twelfth year of the reign of our sovereign Lord King George
 the third a part of the lands (not exceeding one half) belonging to the aforesaid
 Indians of the Nottoway Nation lying on the South side of Nottoway River
 and not in the actual Possession of the aforesaid Indians was vested in the said
 Edwin Gray Thomas Charles Taylor and John Blow as Trustees
 upon Trust that they the said Trustees or any two of them being thereby
 empowered might by good and sufficient Deeds duly Proved Recorded
 demise or lease the said Lands for twenty one years so that the Quantity of land
 should not exceed 300 acres in any one lease to such Person or Person and for
 such Rent or Rents as they the said Trustees or any two of them should judge
 Reasonable under the Provisions and conditions hereafter mentioned
 but more Particularly set forth and Expressd in the aforesaid Act of
 General Assembly as References being thereunto may more fully & better
 appear Now This Indenture witnesseth that the said Edwin Gray Thomas
 Charles Taylor and John Blow Trustees for the said Indians for and
 in consideration of the yearly Rent of 10 shillings hereinafter reserved mention
 and Contained HAVE demise granted and to farm let and by these Presents do demise
 grant and To Farm let unto the said Henry Taylor his Executors and assigns
 one Lot or parcel of Land called by the Name of N^o 7 containing 265 being Part of the
 aforesaid Tract of land belonging to the aforesaid Indians and not in their Actual
 Possession and bounded as follows to wit beginning at a black Gum in the line N^o 6
 thence N^o 11 W 158 Poles to a Pine standing in the River thence up the River
 to a Pine at corner of the line of the Indians Fishing Place thence along the said
 line N^o 11 W 10 Poles to a Gum in the same thence along line of N^o 11 S 17 W 265 Poles to a
 Red oak in the line of N^o 10 thence along the line of N^o 8 S 45 E 174 Poles to a
 Pine at right Inwards a corner of N^o 5 thence along the line N^o 5 N 17 E 250 Poles to the
 Beginning together with all ways waters water courses woods underwoods Profits Privileges
 and appurtenances whatsoever to the said Premises belonging or in anywise appertaining
 To have and to hold the said 265 Acres of Land and other Premises with appurtenances
 unto the said Henry Taylor his Executors and assigns from the Date of these
 presents for and during the term of 21 years from thence next ensuing and fully to be
 complete and Ended Yielding and Paying therefore yearly every year during
 the said Term hereby granted unto the said Trustees or the Survivors of them the
 yearly rent or sum of Ten Pounds current money of Virginia on the first day of Jan
 uary and the said Henry Taylor for himself his heirs Executors and assigns
 with hereby Covenant grant agree to and with the said Trustees & the Survivors of them
