This Indenture made on this 12 day of Nov in the year of Christ 1774
Between Arthur Booth of the County of Southampton of the one part
Rich^d Blow of the County of Sussex of the other part witnesseth that for
consideration of the sum of eighteen pounds & three pence which is the said
Arthur Booth justly indebted to the s^d Rich^d Blow & honestly desired to
secure & pay to him & for further consideration of the sum of five
shillings & six pence to the s^d Arthur Booth, in hand paid by the said
Rich^d Blow at & before the sealing & delivery of this the receipt whereof
he doth hereby acknowledge & thereof of every part thereof doth, exonerate
& discharge the s^d Arthur Booth, his heirs & admors & the said
Arthur Booth hath granted, bargained, sold & confirmed & by these
Premises do grant bargain sell & confirm to the s^d Rich^d Blow his heirs
and assigns forever one negro Girl named Lavey about seven years
old with all the appurtenances belonging or in anywise appertaining to
the Premises hereby granted & intended to be granted & the Reversions
& Reversions Remainders & Remainders & all Services Benefits & Profits
of the s^d Neg. girl & Premises & all my rights Claims Interests and
Securities relating to the same To have and to hold the s^d Negro
& other premises unto the s^d Richard Blow his heirs & assigns forever
to the only proper use and behoof of him the s^d Rich^d Blow his heirs and
assigns forever & the s^d Arthur Booth doth hereby grant for himself
for his heirs that the s^d Arthur Booth for himself & for his heirs & every of
them shall and will warrant & forever defend the said Negro and
other Premises & every part & Article thereof with all & singular
its rights & Appurtenances unto the s^d Rich^d Blow his heirs & assigns
forever against him the s^d Arthur Booth & against his heirs
& every of them against every other person whomsoever Upon Trust
nevertheless that the s^d Richard Blow his heirs & admors or assigns
shall (after the first day of February in the year of Christ 1775 or as
soon as the s^d Rich^d Blow his heirs & admors or assigns shall think
proper, or the s^d Arthur Booth shall request (whichever of these two
Circumstances shall first happen) sell for the best price that can be gotten
after giving ten days public notice the s^d Negro & premises & out of the
money arising from such sale discharge pay & satisfy to him the s^d
Richard Blow the sum of Eighteen pounds & three pence with lawful
Interest from the twelfth day of November 1774 untill the same
shall be fully discharged & the Expenses attending the drawing and
recording this Indenture & the contingent charges of the sale & all other
& other necessary Expenses that shall attend the securing & obtaining
the above mentioned Money or performing any thing or shall be
necessary relative to the intent of this Indenture & that the said
Richard Blow his heirs & admors or assigns shall pay or cause to be
