This Indenture made this eleventh day of February in the fourteenth year of the reign of our Lord George the third now King of Great Britain &c. And in the year of our Lord Christ one thousand seven hundred and seventy four Between Chaplain Williams of the parish of St. Matthew in the ^{county of} province of Georgia and his wife of the one part and Stephen Williamson of the parish of St. Luke in the county of Southampton in the colony and dominions of Virginia of the other part Witnesseth that the said Chaplain Williams and for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred and fifty pounds current money of Virginia to them in hand paid by the said Stephen Williamson at or before the inscaling and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof he the said Chaplain Williams doth hereby acknowledge and thereof acquit and discharge the said Stephen Williamson his heirs and assigns by these presents Have and each of them hath granted bargained sold aliened released and conveyed and confirmed and by these presents do grant bargain sell alien release convey and confirm unto the said Stephen Williamson and to his heirs and assigns all that tract of land lying and being in the parish of Saint Luke and county of Southampton aforesaid and on the south side of Tamarara creek containing by estimation one hundred and fifty acres to the same more or less and bounded as follows To wit beginning at a lightwood stake in the county line thence by the said line west forty two poles to a red oak in James Allens line thence by the said Allens line north ten degrees West one hundred and thirty poles to a hickory and north sixty degrees west one hundred and eight poles to a white oak by the side of the quarter branch then down the said Branch north seventy two degrees West eighty four poles to a pine in Henry Leamons line to the head of Marsh branch then down the courses of the said Branch to Thomas Pitmans line then along
