aforesaid of the other part Witnesseth that the said John Johnson  
son and Celia his wife for and in consideration of the sum of forty  
five pounds current money of Virginia to him in hand paid by  
the said Josiah Johnson the receipt whereof the said John  
Johnstone doth hereby acknowledge and thereof acquit and  
discharge the said Josiah Johnson his heirs Executors and  
Administrators by these presents do and each of them doth  
grant Bargain Sold aliened enfeoffed and confirmed & by  
these presents do and each of them doth grant Bargain sell  
alien alien enfeoff and confirm unto the said Josiah Johnson  
to his heirs and assigns for ever All that plantation Tract  
or parcel of land situate lying and being in the County aforesaid  
said containing by estimation Two hundred and ten acres  
or the same more or less and bounded as followeth Viz<sup>t</sup>  
Beginning at a Red oak a corner Tree of Duke's land  
running thence north sixty degrees east one hundred &  
fifty four poles to a pine standing in the horse pen swamp  
a corner of Richard Vicks land and Stephen Johnson's then  
up the meanders of the said swamp to a gum a corner Tree  
of Richard Richs land thence along the said Richs line  
south forty seven degrees west eighty poles to a Red oak  
standing in the said Richs line thence south thirty degrees  
east two hundred and twenty poles to the beginning  
which said tract or parcel of land was inherited by the said  
John Johnson in right of his father with all houses out
