This Indenture made the eleventh day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and seventy five between William Turner and Elizabeth his wife of the parish of St Lukes and county of Southampton of the one part and William Miller of the same parish and county of the other part Witnesseth that the said William Turner and Elizabeth his wife for and in consideration of the sum of Two hundred pounds to them in hand paid by the said William Miller the receipt whereof they do hereby acknowledge have granted bargain'd and sold and by these presents do grant bargain and sell unto the said William Miller and to his heirs and assigns for ever all that the said William Turner and Elizabeth his wife their plantation tract or parcel of land lying and being in the parish and county aforesaid containing Three hundred and sixty four acres being the survey of purchased by the said William Turner of the Malloy Indians bound as follows Beginning at a Maple a corner of it on the West side of Buckhorn swamp in the edge of the low grounds and at the mouth of the bridge branch running up the meanders of the said Branch to a small pine in the branch thence along a line of marked trees S 3 E 100 poles to a pine on barrens roads thence up the said road to a black Jack a corner on the road side N 70. W 318 pole to a white oak in the edge of Buckhorn swamp aforesaid and down by the edge of the low grounds of the said swamp to the beginning and all houses out houses fences orchards Trees ways waters water courses profits
