This Indenture

made the sixth day of March one thousand seven hundred and seventy five Between William Vaughan of Southampton county of the one part and cordall Crockett of the county aforesaid of the other part Witnesseth that the said William Vaughan for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred and fifty pounds current money of Virginia to him in hand paid by the said Cordall Crockett at and before the inscaling and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof the said William Vaughan do hereby acknowledge and therewith acquit the said Cordall Crockett his heirs Executors and administrators Hath granted bargained sold aliened Released and confirmed and by these presents doth grant bargain sell alien Release and confirm unto the said Cordall Crockett his heirs and assigns for ever one certain tract parcel or dividend of land containing by estimation two hundred and ten acres (more or less) situate lying and being in the county aforesaid on the north side of the flat swamp and bounded as follows To wit Beginning at the mouth of a small Branch that Runs up the upper side of Thomas Westbrook's plantation and running up the various courses of the run of the said Branch to a marked Pine standing in the said Branch Then by a line of marked trees North eastwardly to the center of a Red oak a hickory and a lightwood Knot in the back line of the cren Patent so round by the back line thereof to the old patent line so round the old patent line to Benjamin Clements line then by the said Clements line to the run of the swamp
