This Indenture made this 13th day of July one thousand
 seven hundred and seventy five between Olive Brown and John
 Brown of Southampton County of the one party and Thomas Morris
 and James Morris of the county aforesaid of the other party
 Witnesseth that the said Olive and John Brown for and in con-
 sideration of the sum of Forty pounds current money of Virginia
 to them in hand paid at or before the enclosing and delivery of
 these presents the receipts of which and themselves fully satisfied
 contented and paid they doth hereby acknowledge hath granted
 Bargained and sold alien and confirmed and by these presents
 doth give grant Bargain and sell alien and confirm unto the
 said Thomas and James Morris their heirs and assigns for-
 ever one certain tract or parcel of land lying and being on the
 south side of the round hill swamp in the county aforesaid con-
 taining Two hundred acres and bounded as followeth
 Beginning at a pine a corner betwixt John Willings and the
 said Browns thence south thirty six degrees west one hundred
 and forty four poles to a red oak thence north eighty ^{one} degrees
 west forty eight poles to a pine thence south twenty three degrees
 west one hundred and ninety six poles to four trees chopped inwards
 in a small branch thence south sixty degrees east fifty eight pole
 to a pine near the narrow way road then north east one hundred
 and sixty six poles to a red oak then north fifteen degrees east
 ninety one pole to a red oak then north east one hundred and
 fifty pole to a Black oak then north fifty degrees west fifty
 seven pole to a pine thence south eighty three degrees west twenty
 pole to a pine thence south thirty six degrees west Forty
 pole to the beginning Also all woods underwoods ways water
 and water courses and also the Reversion and Reversions
 remainder and remainders rents and services of the said
 premises and of every part thereof and also all the estate
 right title interests claim and demand whatever of them the
 said Olive and John Browns of en and to the said premises
 and of every part thereof to have and to hold all and singular
 the said premises above mentioned and every part and parcel
 thereof with their appurtenances unto the said Thomas and
