the said swamp to Crumplers Branch thence up the said Branch
to a pine a corner of Fishers land thence north sixty three
degrees east one hundred and twenty two pole to a lightning-
post standing on Broad water road thence along the road to
the head of the Merry Branch thence down the said Branch
to a fork a corner of Thomas Grays deceased thence up the
north prong along Grays line to Broad water road thence along
the said road to a white oak a corner of Joseph Vassons thence
along Vassons line north thirty degrees west one hundred &
six pole to a pine another corner thence by a line of marked trees
south seventy seven degrees west to a pine a corner in Crumplers
Branch thence down the said Branch to the Merry Branch thence
down the said Branch to Thomas Chappells line thence along
the said Chappells line to the Beginning To have and to hold
the aforesaid commodities and advantages whatsoever to the said
Land belonging or in any wise appertaining unto him the said
Humphrey Drenvy and Sarah his wife his heirs and assigns forever
in as full and ample manner to all true intent and purposes
and I do hereby further covenant promise and grant to and
with the said Humphrey Drenvy his heirs and assigns that
the said land and every part and parcel thereof is free and clear
from all other gifts grants or Mortgages and all other Incum-
brances whatsoever in the which I do hereby transfer and oblige
myself my heirs &c. to warrant and defend this my sale of
all and singular the premises together with their and every of
their appurtenances unto him the said Humphrey Drenvy his
heirs and assigns forever against all and every other per-
son or persons shall and will warrant and forever defend
by these presents In Witness whereof the said James Atkinson
and Sarah his wife have hereunto set our hands and seals the
