Turner have agreed to give the said Andrews one hundred
sixty two pounds ten shillings And whereas the said William
Andrews have purchased a certain tract of land of John
Ruffin for which the said Andrews have agreed to give
one hundred and sixty two pounds ten shillings which the
above mentioned Thomas Turner was my security to see the
money paid and that the said Thomas Turner have agreed
with William Andrews to pay the above mentioned John
Ruffin the money that he was to give him for his land in
consequence whereof the said Turner shall be discharged from
paying the said Andrews for his land and that the said
Andrews have agreed to the same Whereof I have hereunto set
