This Indenture made this 31st day of May in the fifteenth
 year of the reign of our Sovereign Lord George the third by the Grace of
 God of Great Britain France and Ireland King Defender of the faith
 &c. and in the year of our Lord Christ one thousand seven hundred
 and seventy six Between James Ingram and Mary his wife
 of the County of Northampton in the province of North Carolina of the
 one part and William Simmons of the County of Southampton of the
 other Witneseth that the said James Ingram and Mary his
 wife for and in consideration of the sum of Two hundred Pounds
 Current money of Virginia to them in hand paid hath granted Bargained
 and sold aliened and confirmed and by these presents doth grant
 Bargain and Sell Alien and Confirm unto the said William
 Simmons his heirs and assigns one certain tract or parcel of land
 situate lying and being in the County of Southampton aforesaid
 containing by estimation one hundred acres more or less beginning
 at a lightwood post in the Earth on the said William Simmons
 line then along the said line to a pine in the Branch then along
 the Branch to a new marked red oak then along a line of new
