This Indenture made this 8th day of January in the year of our lord christ 1777 Between John Johnson and Elizabeth his wife of the parish of St Luke and County of Southampton of the one part and John Reese of the said parish and County of the other part Witnesseth that the said John Johnson and Elizabeth his wife for and in consideration of the sum of Fifty pounds of good and lawful money of Virginia to them in hand paid by the said John Reese the receipt whereof they the said John Johnson and Elizabeth his wife doth hereby fully acknowledge they the said John Johnson and Elizabeth his wife hath and doth grant bargain and sell alien enfeof and confirm unto the said John Reese a certain tract or parcel of land situate lying and being in the parish and County aforesaid and on the North side of the three creeks containing as is esteemed 83 acres be the same more or less and is bounded as follows to wit Beginning on the south side of little plowman swamp at a pine thence along a line of marked trees that divides the said land from Benj^m Lewis land a south course to a scrub oak a corner thence a south east course along a dividing line between the said tract to a scrub oak a corner thence a north course along a line between this said land and the said Reeses old plantation land to a
