whether she be willing the same should be recorded in the court
of our said County and when you have her acknowledgement and
examined her as aforesaid that you distinctly and openly certifye
us thereof in our said court under your seal sending then thereto
this said Indenture and this writ Witnes Samuel Kello
Clerk of our said Court at his Office the 12th day of June in the
sixteenth year of our Reign Sam^r Kello

Southampton Pursuant to the within Decrees we the Sub-
scribers therein mentioned Personally went to the said Mary wife
of the said William Andrews and privately and apart from her said
husband examined her whether shee freely and voluntarily without his
persuasions or threats acknowledged the deed of Feoffment herunto
annexed and relinquished her right of dower in the lands therein men-
tioned to be conveyed to Thomas Turner to all which she answered that
she did and was willing the same should be recorded Certified under

year of our Lord Christ one thousand seven hundred and seventy six between
Jacob Kennebrew of the County of Southampton Virginia Edith his wife and
Ann his mother of the one part and Samuel Nicholson of the same County
of the other Witneseth that the said Jacob Kennebrew Edith his wife
and Ann his mother for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred
and fifty pounds current money of Virginia aforesaid to the said
Jacob Kennebrew in hand paid by the said Samuel Nicholson the
receipt whereof he doth hereby acknowledge Have granted bargained
sold aliened & enfeoffed and by these presents do grant bargain sell
alien and enfeoff unto the said Samuel Nicholson his heirs and
assigns for all that tract or parcel of land which the said Jacob
Kennebrew bought of his father William Kennebrew deceased con-
taining by estimation two hundred and fifty acres more or less lying
and being in the said County of Southampton and bounded as follows
from the said William Kennebrew deceased to the said Jacob Kenne-
brew bearing date the fifth day of July one thousand seven hundred
and sixty eight reference being thereunto had may more fully appear
And
