This Indenture made the 21st day of November in the year
 of our Lord Christ one thousand seven hundred and seventy six between
 Jonathan Bowing and Martha his wife of the parish of Stottoway and
 County of Southampton of the one part and John Can Starphen of the parish
 of Newport and County of Isle of Wight of the other part Witnesseth
 that the said Jonathan and Martha Bowings for and in Considera-
 tion of the sum of Eighty five pounds lawfull money of Virginia to
 them in hand paid by the said John Can Starphen the receipt where-
 of the said Jonathan and Martha Bowing doth hereby acknowledge
 and thereof acquit and discharge the said John Can Starphen his
 heirs Executors and Administrators by these presents hath granted
 bargained sold aliened enfeoffed and confirmed and by these pre-
 sents doth grant bargain sell alien enfeoff and confirm unto the
 said John Can Starphen and to his heirs and assigns forever all
 that tract or parcel of land situate lying and being in the aforesaid
 parish of Stottoway and County of Southampton containing by estima-
 tion one hundred acres be the same more or less and bounded as
 followeth To wit beginning at the mouth of the Catben swamp and
 so along up the swamp to a branch called the spring branch and so
