This Indenture made this eighth day of February in the year of our Lord Christ One thousand Seven hundred and Seventy Eight Between Matthew Wills and Mary his wife of the County of Southampton in parish of Nottonway of the one part and John Johnson of the County in a parish aforesaid of the other part witnesseth that for and in Consideration of the just and full sum of Eighty Pounds Current money of Virginia by the said John Johnson to them in hand paid at or before the sealing and delivering of these presents the whereof the said Matthew Wills and Mary his wife doth hereby Acknowledge and thereof acquit and discharge the said John Johnson his heirs and assigns forever by these presents they the said Matthew Wills and Mary his wife doth grant bargained sold Alien released and Confirmed and by these presents doth grant bargain sell sit over Alien released and Confirm all that plantation the said John Johnson his heirs and Assigns forever all that plantation Mesuage tract or parcel of land being the land the land given by John Sola and conveyed to the said Wills by deed bearing date the eighth day of January one Thousand Seven hundred and Seventy three the said tract containing by estimation One hundred and Eighty two Acres more or less and bounded as follows to wit begining at a Gun or pine in the branch a corner tree of the said Johnson & Hitchins orphans family James Flowers's land thence by said Hitchins line to a corner betwixt Benjamin Barnes's land thence said Barnes line to Black Oak a corner tree of the land which Josiah Johnson line to fine a corner tree of Took Parsons thence said Parsons line to a branch line
