This Indenture made this the forth day of January one thousand Seven hundred & Seventy nine Between Henry Deberry of Southampton County and State of North Carolina & Joseph Simmons of Southampton County & State of Virginia Witnesseth that the said Henry Deberry for and in consideration of the sum of one thousand Two hundred & fifty Pounds, to him in hand paid by the said Joseph Simmons at or before the sealing & Delivering of these presents the Receipt whereof the said Henry Deberry doth Acknowledge hath granted Bargained sold Aliened enfeoffed & confirmed & by these presents doth Grant Bargain Sell Alien enfeoff and confirm unto the said Joseph Simmons and to his Heirs & assigns forever all that Tract or parcel of Land, lying and being on the North Side of Meherring River in Southampton County in Virginia Containing by Estimation Two hundred and Seventy five acres more or less and Boundaries as followeth Beginning at a pine on Meherring River thence North fifty degrees west forty Poles to Three Trees Chopt Inwards thence North Forty degrees East Sixteen poles to a Cypress in the Bear Mash Swamp, thence up the Various Courses of the Edge of the said Swamp to the mouth of the Little Swamp & down the various Courses of the run of said Swamp to a Cypress, thence a Straight Line to the head of the deep Gut, thence down the deep to the River, thence up the said River to a pine the beginning, which said Land will more fully appear in a deed from William Briant to the said Henry
