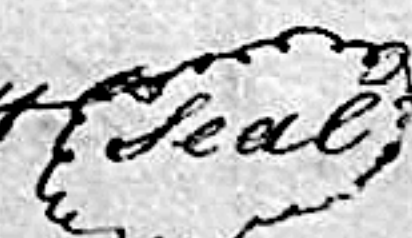


Doth bargain sell assign make over & deliver unto the said Edward Britt
and to his Heirs and assigns these following negrow slaves to wit Ben & Lagon
together with the future increase of the said slaves To hold the same to the
said Edward Britt and to his heirs and assigns forever in trust and
confidence and to their uses intents and future hereafter mentioned &
to other uses intents or purpose whatsoever that is to say in trust
that he the said Edward Britt his Heirs Executors and administrators
shall and will apply the use labour and profits of the said slaves
and their increase to and for the sole benefit and Advantage of him
the said Jacob Williams and according to his direction and appoint-
ment for and during the term of his natural life and no longer that
for and immediately after the death of him the said Jacob Williams
that he the said Edward Britt shall and will by writing under
his hand and Seal convey and make over the aforesaid slaves and such
increase as may be living unto the Child or Children that the said
Jacob Williams may leave or be living at his death as aforesaid and
to their heirs and assigns forever and the said Edward Britt for
himself his heirs executors and administrators doth hereby covenant
grant and agree to and with the said Jacob Williams his heirs
Executors and administrators by these presents that he the said Edward
Britt his heirs executors & administrators shall & will accept
and take upon himself the trust and confidence hereby reposed
in him and will well and truly ^{execute} ~~except~~ the same according to the
true intent and meaning of these presents In Witness whereof
the parties have here to set their hands & Seals the day and year

Worrell for and in Consideration of the sum Five Shillings Current Money
of Virginia to him in hand paid by the said Joseph Johnson Worrell the
Receipt whereof he doth hereby Acknowledge and himself fully content
