of twenty pounds Current Money of Virginia the receipt whereof
the said Burwell Williams on doth acknowledge hath granted
Bargain sold aliened and confirmed and by these presents doth
grant Bargain sell alien and confirm unto the said Benjamin Harris
and to his heirs and assigns forever one certain tract or parcel of Land
lying and being in the County of Southampton containing by estimation
one hundred and thirty three Acres more or less and bounded as follows
beginning at a white Oak in the said Harris's old line thence by the
said Harris's old line south fifty five degrees East to a live oak South
seventy four Degrees East seventy Two pole to a dead pine thence South
seventy three Degrees East eighty pole to a red oak a corner of the said
