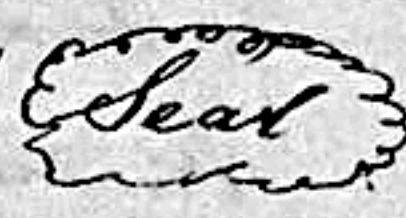

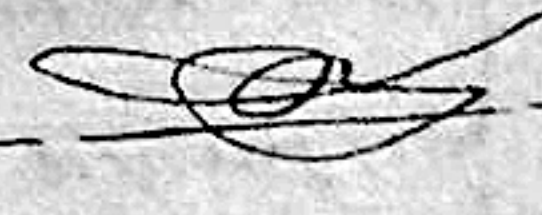

This Indenture made this Eleventh day of March in the year of our Lord Christ one thousand Seven hundred and seventy nine between William Coexecutor of the last will and Testament of Edmund Gay deceased and James Taylor of the one part and William Williams of the County of Southampton and a state of Virginia of the other part Whereas by the last will and Testament of Edmund Gay deceased bearing date the Day of one hundred and Seventy Seven he the said Edmund Gay amongst other things did direct by his will that the Lands he died possessed of should be sold by William Scott his executor for the best price it would fetch and the money arising by such sale be laid out as by his said will directed being thereunto lawfully appeared witnesses that the said William Scott and James Taylor for and in consideration of the sum
