This Indenture made this fourteenth day of October in the year of our Lord Christ one thousand Seven hundred Seventy and Nine between Joseph Williams of Halifax County in the state of North Carolina and Isaac Williams of the County of Southampton in the state of Virginia administrators with the will annexed of James Moore late of the aforesaid County of Southampton deceased of the one part and Joseph Briggs of the County of Sussex Virginia of the other part where as the said James Moore was in his live time and at the time of his death seized in fee simple of and in one certain plantation tract and parcel of Land whereon he the said James Moore formerly lived and also one certain tract and parcel of Land adjoining thereto whereon Richard Salton now lives situate lying and being in the parish of Northway & County of Southampton aforesaid containing by estimation five hundred and seven acres including both tract be the same more or less inclusively comprized and bounded as follow to wit beginning at a white oak Robert Picket's Corner then South 57 west thirty five pole to a gum then South five degrees east fifty six pole to a gum then North thirty nine degrees west one hundred and ten pole to a pine a corner tree of the Land formerly John Chasens then South forty eight degrees west Fifty ^{eight} poles to a red oak another corner of the
