This Indenture made this fifteenth day of March in the second year of the Commonwealth of the United States anno domini one thousand seven hundred and twenty nine between John Waller of the County of Southampton of the one part and Benjamin Waller his son of the said County of the other part witnesseth that the said John Waller for and in consideration of the sum one hundred pounds good and lawfull money of the colony of Virginia to him in hand paid by the said Benjamin Waller at or before sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt hereof the said John Waller doth acknowledge himself and them of acquit & discharge the said Benjamin Waller his heirs Executors and assigns and every of them by these presents he the said John Waller hath granted bargained sold released and forever quit claim and confirmed unto the said Benjamin Waller in the actual possession now by virtue of this Bargain and Sale to him made by the said John Waller unto the said Benjamin all that parcel of land lying and being in Waller's parish and in the County aforesaid adjoining upon Nottoway River on the North side and being part of a tract of land and patent granted to Mr. Richard Washington bearing date the sixteenth day of December 1751
