given and granted and by these presents do freely give
grant unto the said Benjamin Blunt his heirs and assigns
forever one negro Boy named Sam to have and to hold
the said boy Sam. to him the said Benjamin Blunt his heirs
and assigns from henceforth as his proper Slave absolutely
without any manner of condition in Witness whereof I have
hereunto set my hand and Seal this first day of January 1780

Bevelly Booth & Elizabeth his wife of Southampton County
of the one part & Etheldred Lancaster of the same county of the
other part witnesseth that the said Bevelly Booth for an in consi-
deration of the sum of five thousand pounds current money to
him in hand paid by the said Etheldred Lancaster the whereof
the said Bevelly Booth doth hereby acknowledge the said Bevelly
Booth hath granted bargained and sold aliened enfeoffed and
by these presents doth grant bargain sell alien enfeoff and confirm
unto the said Etheldred Lancaster his heirs and assigns forever one
certain tract or parcel of land containing by estimation
