This Indenture made the ninth December in the year of our lord Christ one thousand seven hundred & eighty Between Nathaniel Harris of Warren County North Carolina of the one part and James Harris of Southampton County Virginia of the other witnesseth that the said Nathaniel Harris for and in consideration of the Sum of five hundred pounds current money of Virginia to him in hand paid by the said James Harris the receipt whereof the said Nathaniel Harris doth hereby acknowledge sold alone & confirms by these presents do grant bargain have granted bargain & sell alien & confirm unto the said James Harris his heirs and assigns forever one certain tract or parcel of land containing one hundred and fifty acres be the same more or less lying & being in Southampton County on the south side of the flat Swamp being part of a tract of land formerly belonging to Jacob Harris and bounded as followeth Viz beginning at a gum in Jo^s Harrisons line ^{and dividing line} between said land and Lucy Harriss land a cross the plantation to a black Gum in Thomas Turners line thence along said Turners line to corner pine in John Rogers's line thence along said Rogers line to small pine in James Masons line thence along Courses of said Masons line to a corner live oak on flat Swamp thence down the run off said Swamp to the Beginning to have and to hold the said tract or parcel of land with the appurtenances unto the said James Harris his
