Virginia by the said Phillis Moody to them in hand paid before the
reading and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof the said
William Barnes and Milisent his wife doth hereby acknowledge
and thereof acquit and discharge the said Phillis Moody her heirs &c.

William Barnes and Milisent his wife Hath granted bargained sold aliened
released release delivered and confirmed and by these presents doth grant
bargain sell alien enfeoff release release deliver and confirm unto the s^r
