

Warrant held for the County of Southampton the 13th day of February 1783

This indenture was proved by the oaths of Messrs Solomon, Hardy, Doyall and Matthew Jones three of the Witnesses thereto as to, Edmund and Martha Johnson, and was acknowledged by the within married Sarah Johnson, and she being first privately examined as the Law directs, freely and voluntarily relinquished her right of Dower to the lands conveyed by the said Indenture, & Ordered to be Recorded

This Indenture made this thirteenth day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and eighty three Between Nathaniel Fells, of the parish of Wotton in the County of Southampton of the one part and Sampson Pitman of the same parish and County of the other part Witnesses that the said Nathaniel Fells for and in consideration of the sum of two hundred pounds current money of Virginia to him in hand paid by the said Sampson Pitman at or before the sealing and delivery of this presents the receipt whereof the said Nathaniel Fells doth hereby acknowledge and thereof acquit and discharge the said Sampson Pitman With good bargain sold aliened released and confirmed, and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell aliened, release and confirm unto the said Sampson Pitman his heirs & assigns, all that plantation tract or parcel of land lying and being in the aforesaid parish and County of Southampton on Round Hill swamp, containing two hundred and ninety seven acres, being part of a patent granted to Jesse Jones bearing date the 12th day of May 1759 & sold & conveyed by the said Jones to Nathaniel Fells party hereto
