This Indenture made this 20th Day of March
 in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred Eighty
 three Between Isa Vasfer of the County of Loudoun
 State of Virginia of the one part and
John Rockelle of the County and State aforesaid of the
 other part Witnesses that for and in consideration
 of the sum of three hundred and thirty three Pounds
 Virginia Currency to the said Vasfer in hand paid by
 the said John Rockelle at or before the sealing and
 delivery of these presents, the Receipt whereof the said
 John Vasfer doth hereby acknowledge thereof & thereupon
 doth release acquit & discharge the said John Rockelle
 his heirs Executors Administrators by these presents he
 the said Isa Vasfer hath granted, bargained, sold aliened
 enfeoffed and confirmed and by these presents doth grant
 bargain sell alien enfeoff and confirm unto the said
 John Rockelle his heirs & assigns forever three tracts or
 parcels of land all lying being in the County aforesaid
 the whole containing by Estimation three hundred
 and thirty three Acres more or less, one of which tracts
 being a patent granted to Nicholas Guesley bearing date
 February twenty eighth one thousand seven hundred and thirty three
 containing one hundred acres bounded according to the known
 and prescribed limits of the patent Reference therunto being
 had will fully appear, The second parcel being a deed granted
 to Isiah Vasfer by Joshua Vick bearing date the eleventh
 day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand seven
 hundred & sixty one, containing by Estimation one hun-
 dred and twenty five acres and admitted to Record the
 same day of the date Reference to the said Deed being had
 its boundaries are fully described, The third and last being
 part of Patent granted to John Vasfer bearing date the
 sixteenth day of June one thousand seven hundred and
 twenty seven containing 525 Acres, this Deed contain-
 ing one hundred and eight Acres, and bounded as follow-
 eth to wit: **Beginning** on Nottoway River at the mouth
 of the Spring branch, thence up the various courses of the
 said
