Grant and Confirm unto the said Ephraim Faircloth one certain
tract or parcel of land lying and being in the aforesaid County & being
part of of the land where he now live, Beginning at a pine in
Q^d John Burrows Line, then along the said Burrows Line to a turkey
oak a corner tree of Ann Brookers then along Line of
Markes trees to the head of a small branch then down the
said Branch to a Maple a corner of Winford Drakes then along
a line of Markes trees to a black oak standing on the side of
the spring Branch another corner tree of Winford Drakes
then up the said branch to a pine a corner of my land then along
a line of Markes trees to the Beginning Containing forty acres
be the same more or less To have and to hold the said
Land free from all claims or demands whatsoever may or
shall be made by any person or persons Whatsoever to the
aforesaid Ephraim Faircloth his heirs executors & assigns
