This Indenture, made this 18th Day of December in the year of Lord One thousand seven hundred and eighty Three Between, Joseph Pope of Southampton County and Matthew Williamson of Bedford County Witnesseth that the said Joseph Pope for and in Consideration of the sum of one hundred Pounds Current money to him in hand paid the Receipt Whereof the said Joseph Pope both Acknowledge hath bargained sold aliened conveyed & confirmed unto the said Matthew Williamson & to his heirs and assigns forever, all that tract or parcel of land situate lying and being in the County of Southampton containing eighty five acres more or less and bounded as followeth Beginning at a Cypress on the South Side of Little Swamp thence south by east fourteen pole to a Pine Line tree of James Monchams Land thence by his said Line south seventy Degrees east sixty eight poles to a Pine then North east One hundred & fifty eight poles to a White Oak then North forty Degrees west sixty six poles to three trees Chopt Inwards in a Line of Matthew Stricklins Land then along Stricklins Line west South West thirty two poles to a Maple by side of Little Swamp
