

Philip Davis of Southampton County in
 Virginia being fully persuaded that Freedom is the
 Natural right of all mankind and that it is my duty to do
 unto others as I would desire to be done by in the like situation
 And having under my care six Negroes whom I have hitherto
 held as slaves of the following names and ages (vizt.) Siz
 eyes about twenty years, Isabell aged about eighteen years
 Eleck aged about twelve years, Peter aged about four years,
 Ben aged two years Lydia aged about one year, I hereby
 emancipate and set free Yet I believe it right for me
 to reserve the prerogative of acting as Guardian over those
 in their non age until they arrive to Lawfull age and
 I do for myself my heirs Executors & Administrators relinquish
 all my right Title Interest and claim or pretension of
 Claim whatsoever either to their persons or to any estate
 they may acquire after they attain to the age above
 which will be as follows Eleck will be of age in May
 1793. Peter will be of age in June 1801. Ben will be of
 age in April 1803. Lydia will be of age in April 1807
 Then to enjoy their full freedom without any interruption
 from me or any person claiming for or by from or under
 me In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand
 and seal this 10th day of May in the year of our Lord one
 thousand seven hundred and eighty four —
