son in law Benjamin Blunt of the county of Southampton  
have given and granted and by these presents do freely give &  
Grant unto the said Benjamin Blunt his Heirs and  
Assigns forever, Twelve Negroes (namely, Ned, Pats, Efus,  
Jesse, Sharper, Ben, Amy, Hilly, Elvia, Lucy, Turkey,  
and Kelly) To have and to hold the said negroes  
to him the said Benjamin Blunt his heirs and Assigns  
from henceforth, as his proper slaves absolutely without  
any manner of condition in witness whereof I  
have hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal this 15<sup>th</sup>  
Day of May 1784
