This Indenture Made this Eleventh Day of February, in
the year of our Lord Christ 1784. Between Hardy Doyale &
Martha Doyale his wife of the County of Southampton and parish
of Stollaway of the one part and Carr Doyale of the same parish &
County of the other part Witnesseth that the said Hardy
Doyale and Martha Doyale his wife for and in consideration of
the sum of Fifty five pounds Current money of Virginia to him
in Hand already paid by the said Carr Doyale at or before the
making and Delivery of these presents the Receipt whereof they
the said Hardy Doyale & Martha his wife doth hereby acknow-
ledge and thereof acquit & discharge his Executors and
Administrators forever he the said Hardy Doyale & wife Martha
Doth Grant Bargained Sold aliened Confeffed & Confirmed
and by these presents Doth Grant Bargain and sell alien-
infeoff & Confirm unto the said Carr Doyale and to his heirs &
Assigns forever All that Tract or parcel of Land Situated lying
and being in the aforesaid County of Southampton and on the
south side of Black Water Swamp Containing by Estimation
One Hundred and Fifty acres one hundred of which was
granted to Thomas Turlton by letters Patent Bearing the
seventeenth Day of August One thousand seven hundred Fifty six
and by said Turlton was Conveyed to William Bennett as by
a deed bearing date the 5th Day of May 1758. and by the
said William Bennett Conveyed to Hardy Doyale by deed
bearing date the 20th of December 1762. Two other fifty acre -
beginning thereof was Conveyed to the said Bennett by the
said Bennett by deed bearing date the 12th December 1759. and by
the said Bennett Conveyed to Hardy Doyale by deed bearing
date the 20th December 1762. and bounded as follows (to wit)
Beginning at a poplar on the west side of the Cabin branch
a corner formerly of John Bevinger thence by a line of
(marked trees)
