

(295.) I have and do bear witness, my son Willis Windham, being given by
 grants, and by these presents do freely give, grant unto the
 said Willis Windham his heirs executors or assigns, all the Land
 I own the North side of Windhams Branch, whereon Benja-
 Windham formerly lived, lying in the county of Dorset, and
 bounded as followeth Beginning at a place in Windhams
 branch in allsoes Beeth line: Line thence north East along the
 said Moses Beeth line, to the Lightwood swamp: thence down
 the said swamp to the mouth of Windhams branch thence up
 the said branch to the Beginning To have and to hold
 the said Land unto him the said Willis Windham his heirs
 executors or assigns from hence forth as his Land absolutely
 without any manner of condition In Witness whereof
 I have hereunto set my hand & seal: this day of
 one thousand seven hundred & eighty four
