This Indenture, made the 12th Day of January in the year of
our Lord Christ One thousand seven hundred & Eighty & in Betwixt
Thomas Blake sent of the County of Southampton & Parish of
Saint Luke of the one part And Jeremiah Drew of the other part

Witnesseth that the said Thomas Blake sent for and in
consideration of the sum of Ninety pounds of Good Lawfull
Money of Virginia to him in hand paid at a before the sealing
and Delivering of these presents the receipt whereof he hereunto
Thomas Blake sent both hereto & acknowledged hath granted
Bargained sold Aliened and Conferred, by these presents do
grant Bargain sell Aliene and Confirm unto the said Jeremiah
Drew and to his heirs and assigns forever, One certain
Tract or parcel of Land situate Lying & being in the
said County & Parish on the south side of & Branch's branch
and bounded as followeth Viz & Beginning, at the mouth of
the Mealy mouth meadow up the meadow to the head
to a marked tree, thence along a line of marked trees in
Thomas Flemming's line to a corner tree, thence near west
crossed by a marked line, to the head of the flat meadow in
John Blake's line, to three pursimmon trees in the meadow
thence down the said meadow to the mouth in Branch's
Branch, thence down the said Branch to the Beginning,
containing by Estimation One hundred & twelve Acres &
the same more or less, The said Land is, part of a patent
to William Blake sent & divided to his sons & the said
