Griffin } This Indenture, Made this Tenth day of February in the
Year of Our Lord One thousand seven hundred and Eighty five;
Between James Johnson of the parish of Mottray and County
of Southampton of the one part and Micajah Griffin of the said
Parish and County, aforesaid of the other part Witnesseth
that the said James Johnson of Micajah Griffin for and
in consideration of the sum of One hundred & thirty pounds
Virginia Currency to him in hand paid by the said Micajah
Griffin the Receipt whereof he doth hereby acknowledge
that granted bargained sold aliened, released & confirmed
and by these presents doth grant bargain sell alien release
and confirm unto the said Micajah Griffin & to his heirs &
 assigns all that plantation, tract or parcel of land & premises
with all the Appurtenances now in the tenure & Occupation
of the said Micajah Griffin & to his heirs and assigns, situate
lying & being in the aforesaid parish of Mottray & County
of Southampton on the south side of Black Creek containing
by estimation three hundred and fifty seven Acres be the
same more or less, and bounded as follows. Beginning at a
Willow Oak in the by-press swamp a corner tree, then running to a
small branch to a white Oak a corner tree, then running to a
spring, by-press swamp, up the said spring to a pine a corner ^{tree},
thence Johnson & John Johnson then running a line to a pine a
corner tree John Johnson & James Vick then running a line
marked trees to a lightwood stump joining James Vick & George
Hall, thence running to a pine a corner tree George Hall &
Ephraim Drapers, then running a line to a small branch ^(the)
