To all to whom, these presents shall come Whereas one James
Johnson of the County of Southampton by his Executor Indenture
Bearing date the . . . Day of . . . 1784 did sell and convey
unto Peninah Johnson Administratrix of James Johnson
deceased, and to her heirs and assigns one certain part of
Land wherein the said James Johnson then dwelt lying in the
County of Southampton aforesaid containing by estimation
three hundred and fifty seven Acres, and also four
Negroes (Viz^t) Peter, Hagar, Tom, & Ben, for the Consideration
on the receiving the payment of One hundred and eighty four
Pounds with Interest, then justly due to the said Administratrix
from the said James Johnson, with a proviso, of redemption
on the Payment of the aforesaid sum & Interest to the said
Peninah Johnson her heirs Admors, Exors, and assigns, and whereas
the aforesaid James Johnson hath paid & satisfied the
said Peninah Johnson the aforesaid sum of One hundred
& eighty four pounds and the Interest thereon arising
to the date hereof, Now Know ye that the said Peninah
Johnson for the Consideration aforesaid, gave & by these
Presents do remise release, and forever quit claim unto
the aforesaid James Johnson & to his heirs & assigns forever
all the Estate right title interest claim or demand of
her the said Peninah Johnson for heirs Executors
Admors or assigns of in & the said Tract a parcel of land
and Negroes mentioned to be conveyed in and by the
aforesaid Indenture of Mortgage herein before mentioned
And I do hereby acquit and discharge the aforesaid
Johnson
