 work ways Waters and Water Courses, privileges hereditaments
 and appurtenances thereto belonging or in anywise apper-
 taining and the reversion and reversions, remainder and
 remainders, rents Issues and profits thereof To have
 and to hold, the said Tract or parcel of Land & premises
 to the only proper use and behoof of him of the said William
 Whitehead his heirs and assigns forever, & the said Joseph
 and Mary Atkinson, shall and will warrant and defend
 the said granted Land and premises to the said William
