Know all people to whom, to whom these presents shall come, William
Brown of the County of Southampton do send greeting, Know ye that
I the said William Brown for diverse good causes and
considerations, but more especially for and in consideration
of Two shillings in hand paid me; Together with the love and
affection, which I have & do bear Towards Temperance
Taylor of the said County, have given and granted, and by these
Presents do freely give and grant unto the Temperance
Taylor the three following Negroes (to wit) Betty her son Isaac,
and Mammah, with their Increase forever. Know ye that
the said Temperance Taylor, Hath full power to give and
dispose of the said three Negroes with their increase as she thinks fit.
To have and to hold, the said slaves, absolutely without any
manner of Condition, In Witness whereof, I have hereunto set
my hand & seal this 18th Day of April anno domini - one thousand
seven hundred & eighty five
