 William West, Richard Blaw and Edwin Davis, All which
 Lands, Tenements, Hereditaments and Appurtenances
 thereto Belonging by these presents, I do fully give to him
 the said James Jones his heirs & assigns To have and
 to hold, the said premises with the appurtenances to
 him the said James Jones his heirs and assigns forever -
 to their own proper use and behoof absolutely without any
 manner of Condition In Witness whereof I have
 hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal this 10th day
 of August One Thousand seven hundred and Eighty five
