the Year of our Lord One thousand seven hundred and Eighty five,  
Between, Charles Fowler of the Parish of Saint Luke of the one  
part, and James Barnes of the same Parish of the other part  
Witnesseth, that the said Charles Fowler for and in Consider-  
ation of the sum of Five hundred & Seventy five pounds Current Money of Virginia to him  
in hand paid by the said James Barnes at or before the sealing &  
Delivery hereof the Receipt whereof he hereby Acknowledges & that  
he has granted, Bargained, sold, and by these presents Doth fully & absolutely  
Grant, Bargain, sell, release, and Confirm, unto the said James Barnes  
his heirs and Assigns, all his right, title Interest, & Claim, of in  
and to one Plantation tract or parcel of Land Lying and being in the  
Parish aforesaid Containing, one hundred and Ten Acres More or less  
and Bounded as followeth (to wit) Beginning on the patent line,  
at a red Oak near the piney Branch in Ephraim's Williams line  
then along the said Patent Line to Nathan Barnes's line, then along  
the said Barnes's line, to the Road leading from the three Cypress  
Bridge on Newberry River to Brown's bridge on Mchewiny then along  
the said Road towards Mchewiny, to a pine, the said James Barnes's  
Corner, then along the said Barnes's line to the head of the piney  
Branch, aforesaid then down the run of the said Branch to the  
Beginning, the said One hundred and Ten Acres of Land being  
the Land whereon William Fowler, lives and by his Last Will  
and
