 Randolph Neesum the following five slaves (to wit) Islanders,
 Isaac, David, and I do warrant the title of the said slaves and
 their future increase unto the said Randolph Neesum to
 him and his heirs forever, against the claim and demand of all
 and every person & persons whatsoever, As Witnesses my
 hand and seal this 8th Day of September 1785.
