 that the said Gift which hereby Declare to have been made in
 her lifetime of my said daughter Ann Stewart, may hereafter
 be liable to some objection for want of a decessary writing, conveying
 them to my said daughter, I now by these presents for and
 in consideration of the Natural love & Affection which I bore
 towards her, and now bear towards her children, confirm the
 Gift of the said slaves to be disposed of by Richard Stewart
 among her children to them & their heirs to go & be Vestred
 them as is directed by the Last Will & Testament of the said
 John Myrick deceased, To have and to hold, the
 said two slaves to the said Ann Stewart, and her heirs
 forever, to them in their heirs in manner & form as is above
 expressed, In Witness, whereof I have here set my hand
 and seal this twenty fourth Day of One thousand seven hundred and
 eighty six
