And further that he the said James Moore his heirs executors administrators or assigns the hereby granted lands and premises with the appurtenances convey unto the said Burwell Williamson his heirs and assigns against all and every person & persons whatsoever lawfully claiming the same by from or under him, shall and will warrant and defend by these presents.
