This Indenture made this second day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and eighty seven between Benjamin White of the town of Southampton and parish of Totterway of the County of Devon and Elijah Holloman of the County and parish aforesaid of the other part witnesseth that the said Benjamin White for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred and fifty pounds current money of New England to him in hand paid by the said Elijah Holloman the receipt whereof the said Benjamin White doth hereby acknowledge hath granted bargained sold, and covenanted and confirmed, and by these presents doth grant bargain sell alien, enfeoff and confirm unto the said Elijah Holloman his heirs and assigns forever a certain tract or parcel of land and premises with the appurtenances situate lying and being in the County of Southampton, on the south side of the main blackwater and on the north side of Seacock swamp containing by estimation five hundred and ten acres more or less and known by the most ancient and reputed bounds, it being a tract of Land I purchased of the said Elijah Holloman heretofore, two hundred and seventy-five acres of the said land being part of a patent granted Francis Williamson the twenty-fifth day of April 1701 and twenty-five acres being part of a patent granted Arthur and Joseph Williamson the 20th day of September 1730, the remaining one hundred and sixty acres being a patent granted Benjamin Williamson the 14th day of July 1759 to which patents more particular reference may be had & also all trees woods and under woods common and common of pasture profits commodities, advantages, hereditaments whatsoever to the said tract or parcel of land above mentioned belonging, or in any wise appertaining, of in or upon the same growing or happening or arising and also thereon and neareon remainder and remainders rents and
