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This Indenture made this fourteenth day of November in the year of our Lord Christ one thousand seven hundred & eighty-six

Between William Loyner of the County of Stafford in the Parish of St. Mary of the one part and Lewis Loyner junr & Henry Jones of the Parish and County of Stafford the other part. Whereas the

said Lewis Loyner junr and Henry Jones did at the request of the said William Loyner become bound with him to Miriam Scott, guardian of the said Miriam Scott's Orphans by bond bearing date the 14th day of May 1705 in the sum of one Hundred and forty six

pounds sixteen shillings and two pence current money of Virginia with interest thereon growing due due from the said 20th of May 1705 and it is reasonable and just that the said Lewis Loyner junr and Henry Jones, their heirs and assigns should be

indemnified and secured from all troubles, costs or damages that to them, or their heirs or assigns shall or may happen

accrue or arise by means of their becoming security for the said William Loyner as aforesaid. Now this indenture witnesseth that for securing and saving harmless the said

Lewis Loyner junr and Henry Jones their heirs and assigns from all troubles, costs and damages that to them, their heirs

and assigns may or shall happen accrue, or arise by their becoming security for the said William Loyner as aforesaid

and also for and in consideration of the sum of five shillings current money of Virginia by the said Lewis Loyner junr and Henry Jones to him in hand paid before the enacting

and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof the said William Loyner doth hereby acknowledge and thereof acquit

and discharge the said Lewis Loyner junr and Henry Jones their heirs and assigns forever, by these presents. Be it the said

William Loyner hath granted bargained, sold, aliened, enfeoffed, released, set over, delivered and confirmed and by these presents

doth grant bargain, sell, alien, enfeoff, release, set over deliver, and confirm unto the said Lewis Loyner and Henry Jones

and to their heirs and assigns forever, all that plantation, messuage tract, and parcel of land whereon the said William Loyner and his father Giles Loyner now lives situated, lying and
