seven hundred and eighty seven Between Thomas Williams and
Winifred his wife of the Parish of St. Lukes and County of
Southampton of the one part and Amos Stephenson of the
Parish of St. Lukes and County aforesaid of the other part
witnesseth that the said Thomas Williams and Winifred
his wife for and in consideration of the sum of one Hundred
& fifty pounds to him in hand paid by the said Amos
Stephenson at or before the sealing and delivery of these
In witness whereof the receipt whereof the said Thomas Williams and
Winifred his wife hath granted bargained sold aliened
released and confirmed - and by these presents doth grant
bargain, sell alien release and confirm unto the said
Amos Stephenson his heirs and assigns forever one plantation
tract or certain parcel of land situate lying and being in the
County of Southampton on the south side of Wottonow River
and bounded as follows to wit Beginning on the north side
of Tuckwathunty swamp at John Williams land or upon of
Jacob Williams dec^d thence running up a branch to a maple
from thence to a white oak a corner tree from thence to
