This Indenture made this tenth day of August in the year of our Lord Christ, one thousand seven hundred and eighty-six, Between Josiah Vick of the County of Southampton, and State of Virginia of the one part, and William Murphy of the same County and State of the other part: Witnesseth that the said Josiah Vick for and in consideration of the sum of fifty pounds current money of Virginia to him in hand paid by the said William Murphy at and before the enrolling and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof he the said Josiah Vick doth hereby acknowledge and himself therewith fully and entirely satisfied contented and paid have bargained sold aliened enfeofed and confirmed, and by these presents doth hereby bargain sell alien enfeof and forever confirm unto the said Will. Murphy his heirs and assigns, a certain tract or parcel of land situate lying and in the County aforesaid on the south side of Bottomway swamp and bounded as follows (to wit) Beginning at a Black gum and Ash a corner tree standing in Broad swamp, near the south east corner of William Barnes's plantation, thence near a north east by east course to a small black gum standing in Horsepen swamp, thence near the same course to a white Oak standing in Flaggys run, thence to the main run making an angle and corner, thence down the run of that
