 and four pounds current money of Virginia to him in hand
 paid by the said Benjamin Blunt the receipt whereof the
 said Benjamin Clifton doth hereby acknowledge: have granted,
 bargained, and sold Aligned, and confirmed; and by these
 presents do grant, bargain and sell, alien and confirm unto
 the said Benjamin Blunt his heirs and assigns forever;
 One certain tract or parcel of land, containing two hundred
 and four acres more or less: being and lying in the county
 of Southampton (and Parish of St. Luke) in the fork of
 William Blunt's Mill swamp: and bounded as followeth
 to wit. Beginning at a post in the said swamp on Samuel
 Westbrook's line, thence down the various courses of said
 swamp Southward to the of Flat swamp; thence along the
 said Flat swamp Westward to John Gray's line in the said
 swamp to a Gum, thence along a line of marked trees Northward
 across a road to Herbert's swamp to a Spanish Oak, and
 thence across the said swamp up the lane on Benjamin
