Know all men by these presents that I Williams Whitehead of the county of Southampton for and in consideration of the sum of five pounds current money of Virginia to me in hand paid by James Carr of the county aforesaid, the Receipt whereof I do hereby acknowledge have bargained sold and delivered and by these presents do absolutely bargain sell and deliver unto the said James Carr four Negroes namely Phillis Charles George and Jacob To have and to hold the said Negro slaves to him the said James Carr his heirs or assigns and assigns forever and the said W<sup>m</sup> Whitehead for myself my heirs or assigns and assigns against the last said claim and demand of said Johnson whatsoever to warrant and forever defend the said negro slaves to the said James Carr his heirs or assigns whereof I have herewith set my hand and seal this 15<sup>th</sup> day of June 1787.
