Sum of three hundred pounds Virg. Specie to me in hand paid by the said
Perriss the Receipt whereof I do hereby Acknowledge before the Ensigning
& Delivery of these presents have been granted, obtained and sold unto the said
Joseph Perriss his Heirs or Assigns all & singular all that certain Tract
or parcel of Land lying and being in the County of Southampton aforesaid
and beginning at a Corner Tree which is a white oak on Smiths Line thence
along the S. line to a Corner Tree which is a Hickory on Capt. Jos. Blunt
line thence along the S. line to a Corner Tree on Pools Branch thence up
the S. Branch to William Blunt's line thence down the S. line to the begin-
ing containing Two Hundred & Thirty four acres more or less to have
and to hold the S. Land with all the appurtenances therunto belonging
With all other Advantages or Emoluments therunto appertaining to him
the said Joseph Perriss his Heirs or Assigns for ever in as full & ample a
Manner as the S. Francis Perriss formerly enjoyed it & furthermore the S.
Francis Perriss do for myself & my Heirs &c. Shall & will servant and for ever
Defend the aforesaid Premises Against me my Heirs &c. and against all
Persons Whatsoever to the S. Joseph Perriss and his Heirs for ever Land
