Whereon the said John Bradley lived and which was granted to Isaac Mason by letters patent bearing date the fifteenth of September one thousand Seven Hundred and fifty two containing one hundred and twenty acres more or less and bounded and described as by the said patent is expressed and the said John Bradley departed this life intestate whereby the said land and premises descended to his son and heir at law Bradley the younger subject to the crown of his widow the aforesaid Mary Bradley and the said John Bradley his younger also dying intestate and without issue the same descended to his eldest brother and heir at law Abraham Bradley who sold and conveyed the same to the aforesaid John Simmons by his instrument bearing date the Nineteenth day of February one thousand seven hundred eighty and five AD 1785 witnesseth that the said John Simmons and Ann his wife and Mary Bradley for and in consideration of the just and full sum of Fifty six pounds current money of Virginia by the said James Bell to them in hand paid before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof the said John Simmons and Ann his wife and Mary Bradley doth hereby acknowledge and have of acquit and discharge the said James Bell his heirs and assigns forever and themselves therewith fully and entirely satisfied contented and paid they the said John Simmons and Ann his wife and Mary Bradley have granted bargained sold alredy infested release set over delivered and confirmed and by these presents doth grant bargain sell alien enfeoff release set over deliver and confirm unto the said James Bell and to his heirs and assigns forever all that plantation miffrage tract and parcel one hundred and thirty acres of land and premises aforesaid as being comprised included bounded and described by the said Isaac Mason patent aforesaid all the houses out houses edifices gardens orchards buildings woods ways waters and waters courses profits commodities hereditaments and appurtenances whatsoever to the same belonging or in any wise appertaining and the invasion and invasions remainder and remainders rents issues and profits and all the estate right title interest claim or demand of them the said John Simmons & Ann his wife and Mary Bradley of in and to the sum and every part and parcel thereof to have and to hold the said plantation miffrage tract & parcel one hundred & thirty acres of land and premises with the appurtenances unto him the said James Bell and to his heirs and assigns forever to the only purpose uses and behoof of him the said James Bell his heirs and assigns forever and the said John Simmons and Ann his wife and Mary Bradley for themselves their heirs executors & administrators and assigns the said plantation miffrage
